Canadian Parliamentary Internship Program and Canadian Studies Scholarships

Since 2000, I have been the MSU Representative for this five-week Western Kentucky University summer program in Ottawa. Each Spring, I teach a seminar on Canadian Politics to prepare students who intern the following summer.

In the Spring 2004, created the Morehead State University Canadian Studies Scholarship in 2004 to provide financial support for MSU students who participate in the Canadian Parliamentary Internship Program, a five week summer Ottawa program.

The scholarship is funded by the MSU Office of Financial Aid and Department of Geography, Government, and History. Two students received \$500 scholarships in 2004 and 4 students in 2005, 4 in 2006, and 4 in 2007 have received \$1,000 scholarships.
